BY THE GOVERNOR AND PRIVY COUNCIL IN NORTHERN IRELAND.

ABERCORN.

WHEREAS the Town of Newtownbutler, in the County of Fermanagh, was duly appointed and was a town for the conducting

of business cognizable or determinable and usually transacted at General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Fermanagh, and for holding a Civil Bill Court for hearing and determining causes by Civil Bill.

And whereas by an Order dated 24th December, 1896, made by the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council of Ireland, it was ordered and directed that from the 31st December, 1896, the town of Newtownbutler should be discontinued as, and should cease to be a town for the transaction of Criminal and Crown business (except appeals from Petty Sessions and Licensing business) in and for the said County of Fermanagh, and that all such criminal business (except as aforesaid) which was heretofore usually transacted at the said town of Newtownbutler should be transferred to, and should from the date aforesaid be transacted and conducted at the town of Enniskillen in the said County of Fermanagh.

And whereas a Petition has been presented to us from the Solicitors practising in County Fermanagh praying that the Civil Bill Division of Newtownbutler Quarter Sessions be abolished.

And whereas the said Petition having been duly considered by us, it appears to us to be expedient to make the Order following:—

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice and consent of His Majesty's Privy Council in Northern Ireland, by virtue and in pursuance of the powers vested in Me by the Civil Bill Courts (Ireland) Act, 1851, the Chairman of Quarter Sessions (Ireland) Jurisdiction Act, 1876, the County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877, the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish

Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, and the Orders made thereunder, and of all other Acts and powers Me thereunto enabling, do hereby Order and direct that from and after the October of Michaelmas Sessions of this present year, 1923, the holding in the said town of Newtownbutler of any Court for hearing and determining causes by Civil Bill or for transacting any business cognizable or determinable at any General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace shall cease and be discontinued and the hearing of Appeals from Petty Sessions, the licensing business, the hearing and determining causes by Civil Bill, and all other business which after the said Order of 24th December, 1896, were still transacted or conducted by the Civil Bill Court or the General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace at the said town of Newtownbutler shall be transferred to and shall from the said October or Michaelmas Sessions of the present year be transacted and conducted at the town of Enniskillen in the said County of Fermanagh, of which all persons concerned are hereby required to take notice.

#### EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section one hundred and nine of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, (in this Order referred to as "the Act"), that the Act shall come into operation on the appointed day, and that the appointed day shall be such day, not being earlier than the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, as the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council appoint, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act, for different education areas or parts of education areas, and for different persons or classes of persons:

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, do hereby order as follows:—

1. I appoint the first day of October, 1923, as the appointed day for the purpose of the provisions of the Act relative to the exercise of powers and the performance of duties by the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland, the Minister of Education for Northern Ireland, and any other Minister or Ministry of Northern Ireland, and relative to the making of Orders in Council by the Governor of Northern Ireland, so far as is necessary to give effect to the provisions hereinafter contained in this Order, and to the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under the Act appointing days, whether for purposes or provisions of the Act or for education areas, parts of education areas, persons or classes of persons.

2. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Order, I appoint the first day of October, 1923, as the appointed day for the purpose of the provisions of the Act mentioned in the first column of Part I of the

Schedule to this Order, so far as they relate to the education areas mentioned in the second column of that Part, and to the extent specified in the third column of that Part and in Part II of that Schedule.

NORTHERN IRELAND TEACHERS' PENSION RULES, 1923.

The Northern Ireland Teachers' Pension Rules, 1923, dated September 22, 1923, made by the Governor with the consent of the Ministry of Finance, under Section 11 of the National School Teachers (Ireland) Act, 1879 (42 and 43 Vic., c. 74).

I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the power given to me by the National School Teachers (Ireland) Act, 1879, and of every other power me thereunto enabling, do, with the consent of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland (in these Rules referred to as "the Ministry"), make the following Rules:—

*Re-employment of Pensioned Teachers.*

(1) Where a teacher has been awarded a Pension by reason of infirmity of mind or body and re-enters the Service, he shall not be entitled to benefits under the Rules of 1914, and Rule 12 of the said Rules shall not have effect unless the Ministry of Education certify to the Ministry that such teacher has, previous to superannuation, given efficient service, and unless such teacher submits medical testimony satisfactory to the Ministry that the state of his health has so improved as to fit him for the efficient discharge of his school duties, and that this improvement is likely to be permanent.

(2) A teacher re-entering the Service who retired on Disablement Pension shall be, and a teacher who retired on other grounds than disability, may be required by the Ministry to submit to examination by a Medical Officer nominated by the Ministry in order to test his fitness for re-employment, the cost of such examination to be defrayed by the teacher so examined.

(3) No pensioned teacher re-admitted to the Service shall be eligible for increased pension until five years' regular and continuous service after re-admission has been completed. In the event of failure to qualify for increased pension under this rule, all premiums paid from the date of re-admission, with Compound Interest thereon at the rate of two and a half per cent. per annum shall be returned to the teacher on leaving the Service.

*Revocation of War Bonus Option.*

(4) Where under the operation of the Irish Teachers' Pension (No. 1) Rule, 1920, a pensioned teacher elected to receive an additional pension calculated on War Bonus, it shall be permissible for such pensioned teacher, on signifying his desire in writing to the Ministry of Finance, to withdraw such election and to revert as from 1st July, 1923, to the Pension which would have been awarded to him had he not exercised such election.

Rules one to four foregoing shall have effect as from 1st July, 1923.

*Preservation of Superannuation Rights on Transfer of Teachers between Northern Ireland and the Irish Free State.*

(5) Where a teacher transfers his service with or without a break from a school in the jurisdiction of the Government of the Irish Free State to a school in the jurisdiction of the Government of Northern Ireland, the service of such teacher prior to transfer shall be reckoned as service for the purposes of the Rules made under the National School Teachers (Ireland) Act, 1879, provided that the Superintendent of the Teachers' Pension Office of the Irish Free State pays to the Teachers' Pension Fund, Northern Ireland, a sum equal to four times the amount of all pension premiums to the credit of the teacher, together with compound interest, at the rate of two and a half per cent. per annum on each premium payment, reckoned up to the date on which such teacher came under the jurisdiction of the Government of Northern Ireland.

(6) Where a Teacher transfers his service with or without a break from a school in the jurisdiction of the Government of Northern Ireland to a school in the jurisdiction of the Government of the Irish Free State, the Ministry of Finance shall pay from the Teachers' Pension Fund, Northern Ireland, to the Superintendent of the Teachers' Pension Office of the Irish Free State a sum equal to four times the amount of all pension premiums to the credit of the teacher, together with compound interest, at the rate of two and a half per cent. per annum, on each premium payment reckoned up to the date on which such teacher comes under the jurisdiction of the Government of the Irish Free State.

(7) Where a teacher who has been dismissed or has retired under the conditions of Rule 13 (4) of the Rules of 1914, or Rule 11 (2) of the Rules of 1897, from the service under the jurisdiction of the Government of the Irish Free State, enters the service under the jurisdiction of the Government of Northern Ireland, such teacher may pay to the Teachers' Pension Fund, Northern Ireland, with compound interest at the rate of two and a half per cent. per annum, any sum repaid to him by the Government of the Irish Free State on such dismissal or retirement, and his service, prior to dismissal or retirement, shall in that case be reckoned as service for the purposes of the rules made under the National School Teachers (Ireland) Act, 1879.

(8) Where a teacher who has retired from the service under the jurisdiction of the Government of the Irish Free State with a pension enters the service under the jurisdiction of the Government of Northern Ireland, the service of such teacher, prior to such retirement, shall be reckoned as service for the purposes of the rules made under the National School Teachers (Ireland) Act, 1879, provided that the Superintendent of the Teachers' Pension Office of the Irish Free State pays to the Teachers' Pension Fund, Northern Ireland, a sum calculated as in Rule five of these Rules, but diminished by a sum equal to the total pension payments made, together with compound interest on each several pension payment reckoned at the same rate and up to the same date as in the case of the premium payments.

(9) Where a teacher who has retired from the service under the jurisdiction of the Government of Northern Ireland with a pension enters the service under the jurisdiction of the Government of the Irish Free State his pension shall

cease, and the Ministry of Finance shall pay from the Teachers' Pension Fund, Northern Ireland, a sum calculated as in Rule six of these Rules, but diminished by a sum equal to the total pension payments made, together with compound interest on each several pension payment reckoned at the same rate and up to the same date as in the case of the premium payments.

(10) All sums payable or receivable by the Teachers' Pension Fund, Northern Ireland, under Rules five, six, eight or nine of these Rules shall be charged or credited as the case may be as to one-fourth to the Teachers' Contribution Account, and as to three-fourths to the Endowment Account.

(11) All sums receivable by the Teachers' Pension Fund, Northern Ireland, under Rule seven of these Rules shall be credited to the Teachers' Contribution Account.

(12) For the purpose of these Rules the Government of the Irish Free State shall be deemed to include the Provisional Government.

Rules five to twelve foregoing shall have effect as from the 1st February, 1922.

#### RURAL DISTRICT OF DOWNPATRICK. PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

WHEREAS the Downpatrick Rural District Council (hereinafter referred to as the Council), being the Local Authority for their District, applied to the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in pursuance of Section 3 (1) of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), for an Order declaring Parts IV and X of the Act to be in force in the District of the said Council, now Notice is hereby given that by Order dated the 21st day of August, 1923, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the said Section 3 (1) of the Act, the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and all other powers in this behalf enabling them, ordered and declared that Parts IV and X of the Act should be in force in the District of the Council as from the 1st day of October, 1923, subject to the adaptations following, that is to say, unless the context otherwise requires references in any part of the Act to the Inspector of Nuisances, the Medical Officer, and a highway or street repairable by the inhabitants at large shall be construed as references respectively to a Sanitary Sub-officer, the Medical Officer of Health of the Dispensary District, and a road or street in the District in charge of or maintainable wholly or partly by or at the expense of the Council or the Down County Council.

The effect of this Order is that under Part IV of the Act a person suffering from an infectious

disease shall not engage in any occupation unless he can do so without risk of spreading the disease; Dairymen may be required to furnish list of sources of supply and to notify infectious diseases existing amongst their servants; Infected clothes not to be sent to laundry; Filthy and dangerous articles to be purified; Child suffering from infectious disease not to attend school; Provisions as to library books; Removal of persons from infected premises; Conveyance of infected persons in public vehicles prohibited; Cleansing and disinfecting of infected premises. Under Part X of the Act the Council may make bylaws with regard to public bathing and may grant licences for boats to be let for hire or carrying passengers for hire and charge annual fees for such licences, and no person shall let for hire any boat not so licensed nor carry or permit to be carried passengers for hire in any boat not so licensed, nor shall carry or permit to be carried in any boat a greater number of passengers than shall be specified in the licence, and before permitting same to be used for carrying passengers for hire shall paint on a conspicuous part of the boat his name and the number of persons it is licensed to carry. Every person acting in contravention of the said provisions shall for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

#### COUNTY OF TYRONE.

And to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland by orders of various dates altered the several District Electoral Divisions in the County of Tyrone:

And whereas it is and was the duty of the County Council of the Administrative County of Tyrone (hereinafter referred to as "the County Council") to divide the said County of Tyrone into Polling Districts:

And whereas more than thirty electors in the said Constituency made representation to the Ministry of Home Affairs that the existing Polling Districts in the Constituency did not meet the reasonable requirements of the electors:

And whereas the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland duly considered the said representation, and after due inquiry, directed the County Council to make the alterations in the existing Polling Districts and Polling Places in the manner deemed proper by the Ministry and set forth in the Schedule to this Order, and the County Council failed to make the said alterations within one month after the said direction was given:

Now therefore the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers vested in it by Section 31 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, as modified by Section

44 of that Act, and by all other powers in that behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby alters the existing Polling Districts and Polling Places in the County of Tyrone, and orders that the Polling Districts and Polling Places set forth in the Schedule to this Order shall be substituted for the existing Polling Districts and Polling Places in the said County of Tyrone.
