## NON-CONTRIBUTORY OLD AGE PENSIONS. RESIDENCE IN THE ISLE OF MAN.

Order dated 30th October, 1944, made by the Ministry of Finance under Section 4 (2) of the Pensions and Determination of Needs Act (Northern Ireland), 1943.

The Ministry of Finance in pursuance of the powers conferred by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Pensions and Determination of Needs Act (Northern Ireland), 1943, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

1. As from the first day of November, 1944, the provisions of the Old Age Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to the Pensions and Determination of Needs Act (Northern Ireland), 1943, shall have effect subject to the Amendments set out in the Second Column of that Schedule.

2. This Order may be cited as the Non-Contributory Old Age Pensions (Residence in the Isle of Man) Order (Northern Ireland), 1944.

## NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1936.

#### THE NATIONAL TRUST BILL (NORTHERN IRELAND).

(The National Trust for Places of Historic Interest or Natural Beauty, Incorporated by the National Trust Act, 1907).

Extension of general purposes and powers of National Trust in Northern Ireland; power for member of the National Trust to occupy Trust property; powers to tenants for life to grant certain properties the subject of settlements to the National Trust; powers to local authorities to assure properties to and to make contributions to the National Trust; power to owners of certain interests in land to enter into covenants with the National Trust restricting the use of that land; provisions as to Bye Laws, costs of Bill repeal and amendment of Acts and incidental provisions.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing

Session by the National Trust for Places of Historic Interest or Natural Beauty (hereinafter called "the National Trust") for leave to bring in a Bill for all or some of the following purposes, that is to say:—

To extend the general purposes of the National Trust in Northern Ireland.

To extend the powers of the National Trust in Northern Ireland.

To permit a member of the National Trust to reside in or occupy any of the Trust property.

To empower a tenant for life to grant certain settled property to the National Trust subject to the consent of the Trustees of the Settlement or under an Order of the Court.

To ensure the right of access of the public to that property or part thereof and to ensure its preservation.

To provide for the inalienability of any land so assured to the National Trust but with power to make leases of and to grant easements in respect of such inalienable properties.

To empower local authorities to assure property to the National Trust or to contribute to the expenses of acquisition by the National Trust of any land or building or the expenses of maintenance and preservation thereof.

To empower an owner of certain interests in land to enter into agreements with the National Trust restricting the planning development or use of that land.

To enact all necessary provisions for giving full effect to the purposes of the proposed Bill.

To enable the Council of the National Trust to repay expenses out of capital or income subject to any trusts imposed by a donor or otherwise.

To provide for the costs of the said intended Bill and Act.

Printed copies of the said Bill will be deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Parliament of Northern Ireland on or before the 17th day of December, 1944.
