#### NON-CONTRIBUTORY OLD AGE PENSIONS. RESIDENCE IN THE ISLE OF MAN.

Order dated 30th October, 1944, made by the Ministry of Finance under Section 4 (2) of the Pensions and Determination of Needs Act (Northern Ireland), 1943.

THE NATIONAL TRUST BILL

(NORTHERN IRELAND).

(The National Trust for Places of Historic Interest or Natural Beauty, Incorporated by the National Trust Act, 1907).

Extension of general purposes and powers of National Trust in Northern Ireland; power for member of the National Trust to occupy Trust property; powers to tenants for life to grant certain properties the subject of settle-ments to the National Trust; powers to local authorities to assure properties to and to make contributions to the National Trust; power to owners of certain interests in land to enter into covenants with the National Trust re-stricting the use of that land; provisions as to Bye Laws costs of Bill repeal and amendto Bye Laws, costs of Bill repeal and amend-ment of Acts and incidental provisions.

- To enact all necessary provisions for giving full
