## SUMMARY JURISDICTION.

### PETTY SESSIONS DISTRICTS AND TIMES.

Order dated 21st February, 1945, made by the Ministry of Home Affairs under the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935.

In pursuance of the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, the Ministry of Home Affairs, after consultation with the County Court Judge and the Resident Magistrate concerned, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

1. As and from the 1st day of March, 1945, Petty Sessions shall be regularly held in the Petty Sessions District of Markethill on the Fourth Monday in each month at 11 a.m.
2. The Order dated the 21st November, 1941, (a) appointing the time for the holding of the Markethill Petty Sessions is hereby revoked.

## NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACTS, 1936 TO 1941.
