GERMAN REPARATION (RECOVERY). The German Reparation (Recovery) (No. 2) Order, 1923, dated October 29, 1923, made by the Board of Trade under the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. 5, c. 5).

The Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The German

Reparation (Recovery) (No. 2) Order, 1923."
2. Any articles of the following description shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any articles in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise that such articles are imported by or on behalf of a Department of His Majesty's Government for experimental or test purposes and that no payment is made therefor, even though they may subsequently be retained by that Department. Dated this 29th day of October, 1923.
