HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE

GOVERNMENT LOANS

GOVERNMENT LOANS ACT (NORTHERN
IRELAND), 1945 (COMMENCEMENT)

Order, dated 29th August, 1945, made by the Ministry of Finance under Section 13 (3) of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945.

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (3) of Section thirteen of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") that the Act shall come into operation on such date as the Ministry of Finance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") may by Order appoint:

Now, therefore, the Ministry in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Act, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The First day of September, 1945, is hereby appointed as the date on which the Act shall come into operation.
2. This Order may be cited as the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945 (Date of Commencement) Order, 1945.

GOVERNMENT LOANS

FEES PAYABLE BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES

The Government Loans (Local Authorities' Fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1945, made by the Ministry of Finance under Section 1 (4) of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, and Section 7 of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (4) of section one of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, and section seven of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Ministry of Finance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") hereby makes the following regulations:—

1. (1) In respect of every loan from the Government Loans Fund, being a loan agreed to be made by the Ministry on or after the date on which these Regulations come into force to a local authority as defined by sub-section one of section twelve of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, there shall be paid to the Ministry by the local authority to whom the loan is to be made fees of the following amounts, that is to say:—
 - (a) on the completion of the mortgage or other instrument securing repayment of the loan—
 - (i) the amount of any stamp duty;
 - (ii) legal expenses on the following scale,

On loans up to £500	... £2 2 0
Loans from £500 to £1,000	£3 3 0
Loans from £1,000 to £2,500	£4 4 0
Loans from £2,500 to £5,000	£5 5 0
Loans from £5,000 to £10,000	£7 7 0
Loans over £10,000	... £10 10 0
 - (b) on the occasion of each advance on account of the loan, a compounded fee for administration and Management expenses at the rate of 4s. (four shillings) for every £100 or part of £100

of the advance, provided that in no case shall the fee payable under this sub-paragraph in respect of the advance be less than £1 (one pound);

- (2) The fees payable in respect of any loan or advance on account thereof shall be paid to the Ministry on or before the date on which such loan or advance is to be made.
2. These Regulations may be cited as the Government Loans (Local Authorities' Fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1945, and shall come into operation on the First day of September, 1945.

GOVERNMENT LOANS

LOCAL AUTHORITIES LOANS
(EXEMPTIONS)

The Local Authorities Loans (Exemptions) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1945, made by the Ministry of Finance under Section 1 (1) of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the proviso to sub-section (1) of section one of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Ministry of Finance hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. (1) In these Regulations
 - (a) "the Ministry" means the Ministry of Finance;
 - (b) "the Act" means the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945;
 - (c) "the appointed day" means the date on which the Act comes into operation.
- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.
- (3) References in this Act to enactments of the Parliament of the United Kingdom shall be construed as references to those enactments as they apply in Northern Ireland.
2. (1) Subject to the provisions of Regulation 3 hereof, nothing in Section 1 of the Act (which provides that notwithstanding anything in any enactment it shall not be lawful for a local authority, without the approval of the Ministry, to borrow any money otherwise than from the Government Loans Fund) shall apply to borrowing by a local authority in the manner, for the purposes, or from the sources following, that is to say:—
 - (a) borrowing for any purpose (other than for the purpose of providing funds for the repayment of any stock) on mortgage, or on local bonds, or corporation bonds which are not marketable or quoted on any stock exchange.

Provided that

 - (1) the total amount outstanding at any one time in respect of the local authority's borrowing in any manner covered by this sub-paragraph (excluding mortgages issued to the Ministry of Finance or to the Commissioners of Public Works in Ireland), and in respect of deposit receipts which have been issued by the local authority for purposes other than temporary borrowing in anticipation of

revenue, shall not exceed the highest total amount so outstanding on any date between the 31st day of March, 1939, and the appointed day, both dates inclusive, so, however, that the maximum amount which the local authority may borrow under this sub-paragraph shall

- (i) be increased or reduced by the amount of any increase or reduction in the authority's outstanding debt of the kinds described in this proviso, which results after the appointed day from the operation of any enactment transferring liabilities to or from the authority and from or to another local authority, and
 - (ii) be increased by the amount of any mortgages issued by the authority after the appointed day in replacement of any advances to the authority from any capital fund (as defined in Section 3 (2) (a) of the Act) or any bank overdraft on loan or capital account which were outstanding at the appointed day.
- (2) the borrowing complies with the following conditions, namely,
- (i) it is for a definite period of not less than 7 years from the date of the borrowing, or if the provisions of any enactment authorising the borrowing or the terms of any sanction given for the borrowing do not permit borrowing for so long a period, for the longest period that the enactment or sanction permits, and
 - (ii) no part of the capital borrowed is repayable before the expiration of the minimum period mentioned in (i), except in equal instalments at regular intervals or by means of an annuity of constant amount, and
 - (iii) the minimum period in (i) is not determinable except by the lender in the event of an emergency;
- (b) temporary borrowing in any manner in the exercise of borrowing powers under Section 15 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, or any corresponding provision of a local Act: Provided that, in the case of temporary borrowing pending the raising of a loan, the provisions of this sub-paragraph shall not apply to borrowing by means of bills of exchange or promissory notes;
 - (c) borrowing on mortgage from any superannuation fund, or from any trust or charitable fund held by a local authority or under its control;
 - (d) borrowing by one local authority of funds which belong to another local authority and which under any enactment the latter authority has power to lend;
 - (e) borrowing by means of instalments received after the appointed day on the security of a mortgage created before the appointed day;
 - (f) borrowing by the issue of securities where the local authority exercises an option to redeem any securities and offers to issue new securities in exchange for the securities to be redeemed;
 - (g) borrowing by the issue of securities in order to provide for the redemption of any securities;

(2) For the purposes of sub-paragraphs (f) and (g) of the foregoing paragraph, the expression "securities" means debentures, bonds, or certificates which are marketable or quoted on any stock exchange, or stock.

3. So long as the making of an issue of capital in the United Kingdom without the consent of His Majesty's Treasury is prohibited by Defence Regulations made under the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, the provisions of paragraph 2 of these Regulations shall not apply to any transaction to which such consent is required, either under such Defence Regulations or under any enactment passed by the Parliament of the United Kingdom on or after the 22nd day of May, 1940 (being the date of the commencement of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1940) until such consent shall have been given.

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Local Authorities Loans (Exemptions) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1945, and shall come into operation on the First day of September, 1945.

MINUTE DETERMINING THE CONDITIONS UPON WHICH GOVERNMENT LOANS MAY BE REDEEMED BEFORE THEIR DUE DATES OF REPAYMENT.

Pursuant to Section 1 (4) of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, the Ministry of Finance hereby determines that, in order to protect the Government Loans Fund from losses in respect of the redemption of Loans Stock, the redemption in advance of the date or dates at which, in accordance with the terms agreed to by the borrower at the time when any loan was made from the Government Loans Fund, the principal of such loans falls due for payment, shall be effected by the transfer to the Ministry:

(a) Of an amount of Loans Stock calculated as follows:—

For every £100 principal of loans to be redeemed, alternatively, Ulster Loans 5% Stock, 1950-1960, to the amount of £100; or Northern Ireland 3% Loans Stock, 1956-1961, to the amount of £120.

(b) (In special cases) of such an amount of cash for every £100 principal of loans to be redeemed as the Ministry may determine, having regard to the market price of the Stock aforesaid and its availability for purchase and cancellation by the Ministry, and subject to the following limitations:—

(1) In relation to loans at rates of interest at 5% per annum or upwards, where the repayment period or unexpired period thereof

(i) does not exceed 5 years, not less than £110 cash for each £100 principal;

(ii) exceeds 5 but does not exceed 15 years, not less than £115 cash for each £100 principal

(iii) exceeds 15 years, not less than £120 cash for each £100 principal.

(2) In relation to loans at rates of interest less than 5% per annum, where the repayment period or unexpired period thereof

(i) does not exceed 15 years, not less than £110 cash for each £100 principal;

(ii) exceeds 15 years, not less than £115 cash for each £100 principal.

Provided always that the Ministry may accept (subject to due notice being received) repayment at any time on the basis of £100 cash for each £100 principal outstanding, in the following cases, namely:

(1) The outstanding balance of loans issued at rates of interest not in excess of 3½% per annum.

(2) Unexpended balances of loans already advanced, where the Ministry is satisfied that the balance is unexpended either because the scheme for which the loan was issued was

less costly than was anticipated, or because it has been definitely reduced in extent, and also that application for repayment of the amount to the Government Loans Fund is made within five years from the date of its issue therefrom.

- (3) Loans issued to local authorities for the purpose of making advances under the Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts (Northern Ireland), 1899 to 1923, when and to the extent that repayment is effected by the proprietor of a house under Section 1 (5) of the Act of 1899, provided that such repayment has not been effected by the creation of a fresh mortgage.
- (4) Loans issued to individuals and subject to repayment over a period of not more than 22 years, provided that if the original loan was in excess of £1,000, the capital repayment to which the concession applies shall be reduced by an amount ascertained on the basis of the proportion which the excess of the original loan over £1,000 bears to the original loan.
- (5) Loans issued under the Glébe Loans (Ireland) Acts.

All former minutes on this subject are hereby revoked.

RATES OF INTEREST ON GOVERNMENT LOANS

The Ministry of Finance hereby gives notice that in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 1 (4) of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, or other statutory provision, the undermentioned rates of interest shall be chargeable on loans or instalments of loans of the following descriptions advanced from the Government Loans Fund, on or after the 1st September, 1945, viz.:-

I.—LOCAL LOANS.

Loans to Local Authorities, as defined in Section 12 of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and secured on Local Rates:-

Loans for periods not exceeding 5 years	2 per cent.
Loans for periods exceeding 5 but not exceeding 10 years ...	2½ per cent.
Loans for periods exceeding 10 but not exceeding 15 years ...	2¾ per cent.
Loans for periods exceeding 15 but not exceeding 30 years ...	3 per cent.
Loans for periods exceeding 30 years	3½ per cent.

II.—LAND AND WORKS LOANS.

(A) Loans to owners and occupiers of land under the Landed Property Improvement (Ireland) Acts:-

Loans for periods not exceeding 22 years	3½ per cent.
Loans for periods exceeding 22 but not exceeding 35 years ...	3¾ per cent.

(B) Loans to Civil Servants for the purchase or erection of houses for their accommodation:-

Loans for periods not exceeding 20 years	3½ per cent.

III.—EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT LOANS.

(A) Secondary and Preparatory Schools:
Loans to the Governors or Trustees of Preparatory, Intermediate and Secondary Schools:-

- (1) For the purchase and erection of school equipment and the establishment and equipping of school libraries—
Loans for periods not exceeding 10 years 3½ per cent.
- (2) Loans for the purchase, erection, extension, or alteration of school buildings—

Loans for periods not exceeding 22 years 3½ per cent.

Loans for periods exceeding 22 but not exceeding 35 years 3¾ per cent.

(B) Public Elementary Schools:

Loans for the purchase erection, or improvement of schools under the Loans for Schools and Training Colleges (Ireland) Act, 1884, and the Education Acts (Northern Ireland), 1923 to 1939:-

Loans for periods not exceeding 22 years 3½ per cent.

Loans for periods exceeding 22 but not exceeding 35 years ... 3¾ per cent.

IV.—OTHER LOANS.

The rates of interest to be charged on local, land and works, and development loans other than those defined in Parts I, II and III of this Notice will be determined by the Ministry of Finance according to the circumstances of each individual case.

METHOD OF REPAYMENT.

Local loans as defined in Part I of the Notice will be repayable, as the Ministry of Finance may determine, either (i) by equal half-yearly instalments of the principal advanced, together with interest on the balance from time to time outstanding, or (ii) by equal half-yearly instalments of annuities calculated to include interest at the rates specified.

Loans defined in Parts II and III of this Notice will normally be repayable by equal half-yearly instalments of annuities calculated to include interest at the rates specified.

Other loans will be repayable by such methods as the Ministry of Finance may determine according to the circumstances.
