

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS)
ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND),
1922 TO 1943.

I, the Right Honourable Edmond Warnock, K.C., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 to 1943, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby delegate unconditionally to the following Police Officer, namely, Captain Sir Richard Pike Pim, V.D., Inspector General of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, all the powers vested in me as Civil Authority under Regulation 23 of the Regulations to which the said Acts apply, to exercise concurrently with me and with any other person or persons to whom a similar delegation may have been or may hereafter be made the said powers throughout the whole of Northern Ireland, such delegation to continue until revoked, and the said Police Officer shall for the purpose of the said Regulation be concurrently with me and such other person or persons the Civil Authority for the whole of Northern Ireland.

EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE).
ROAD VEHICLES—SPEED LIMIT.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 1st day of September, 1945, the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland, by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 70 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, made an Order revoking the Emergency Powers (Defence) (County Down Speed Limit) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby gives notice that after consultation with the Board of Trade they have made an Order under Section 12 of the Finance Act, 1926, viz.—

The Safeguarding of Industries (Optical Lanterns and Cinematographs) (Exemption) Order, 1945.

The effect of the Order is that from 3rd September, 1945, complete optical lanterns and cinematographs are only exempt from duty under the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, if they do not exceed in value 2/- and 3/- respectively.

These limits replace the limits of 4/- and 10/- imposed by Statutory Rules and Orders 1933, No. 369.

The exempted articles remain liable to duty under the Import Duties Act, 1932.
