Graham, who died on the 24th day of August, 1945, at Ballee, Ballymena, aforesaid, by his Will dated the 5th day of October, 1937, after leaving certain specific and pecuniary legacies, made the following charitable bequests:—£100 to the Committee of First Ballymena Presbyterian Church to be used by them for the benefit of said Church in whatever manner they in their absolute discretion think right; £100 to the Ballymena Cottage Hospital; £500 to the Royal Victoria Hospital, Belfast; £100 to the Samaritan Hospital, Lisburn Road, Belfast; £100 to the Children's Hospital, Belfast; £100 to the Committee of Newtowncrommelin Presbyterian Church to be used by them for the benefit of said Church in whatever manner they in their absolute discretion think right, the receipt of the Treasurer of said respective Churches and Hospitals to be a sufficient discharge to the said Executor. Deceased directed his Trustee to pay the residue of his estate

in equal shares to the Foreign and Home Missions in connection with the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, the receipt of the Treasurer of said Missions to be a sufficient discharge to the said Executor.

Probate of said Will was on the 1st day of October, 1945, granted forth of the Principal Registry of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland, King's Bench Division (Probate), to Graham Robinson, of Tullycraugh, in the said County of Antrim, Farmer, one of the surviving Executors named in said Will.
