HAT, CAP AND MILLINERY TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND)

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and the provisions of Section 27 (c) of the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, the Trade Board established under the powers vested in the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, for those branches of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade defined in the Regulations of the said Ministry, dated the Second day of January, 1922, Hereby Give Notice that they propose to vary minimum rates of wages for Female Workers in the Retail Branch of the Trade.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the minimum rates above referred to, and information as to their application, will be given, if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to their Proposal which may be lodged with them within Fourteen days from the Twentieth day of December, 1923. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Boards, 14 Bridge Street, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making Objections should state precisely, and, as far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and the provisions of Section 27 (c) of the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, the Trade Board established under the powers vested in the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, for those branches of the Brush and Broom Trade defined in the Regulations of the said Ministry, dated the Second day of January, 1922, Hereby Give Notice that they propose to vary and fix minimum rates of wages for certain classes of Male and Female Workers.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the minimum rates above referred to, and information as to their application, will be given,

if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to their Proposals which may be lodged with them within Fourteen days from the Twentyfirst day of December, 1923, in the case of the Proposals to Vary, and within one calendar month from the 21st day of December, 1923, in the case of the proposal to fix. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Boards, 14 Bridge Street, Belfast.

It is desirable that persons making Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
