TREATY OF PEACE ORDER, 1919.

NOTICE is hereby given that by agreement between the British and German Governments, the period for lodging Claims under Article 296 of the Treaty of Versailles has been extended.

British creditors who have claims not hitherto preferred against German nationals which come within the provisions of the aforesaid Article must forward proofs of claim to the Controller of the British Clearing Office, Cornwall House, Stamford Street, London, S.E. 1, by the 31st March, 1924, which is the final date for notification. The necessary forms can be obtained on application to the Controller.
