WHEREAS the Council of the Urban District of Cookstown, on the 1st day of May, 1939, submitted proposals to the Council of the administrative County of Tyrone (in this Order referred to as "the County Council") for the alteration of the boundary of the said urban district.

AND WHEREAS the County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section twenty-four of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of all other powers thereunto them enabling, at a meeting held on the 11th day of September, 1939, made an order giving effect to the said proposal.

AND WHEREAS the Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") on the 13th day of February, 1947, duly confirmed the Order made by the County Council with modifications.

AND WHEREAS the Rural District of Cookstown, situate in the administrative County of Tyrone, is now divided into sixteen district electoral divisions, named respectively the Ballyclog, Beaghmore, Coagh, Grange, Killeenan, Killycolpy, Lissan Lower, Mullanhoe, Munterevlin, Oaklands, Oritor, Pomeroy, Slate Quarry, Stewartstown, The Sandholes, and Tullaghoge.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the constitution of the District Electoral Divisions of Grange and Lissan Lower should be altered in the manner hereinafter appearing.

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry, in exercise of its powers under the Poor Relief Acts (Northern Ireland), 1838 to 1937, the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1946, and of all other powers in that behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders and directs that:—

(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in any Order to the contrary the district electoral divisions of Grange and Lissan Lower in the said Rural District shall consist of the townlands, parts of townlands and places set forth by name in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order opposite to the name of such district electoral divisions.

And it is hereby declared that the foregoing provisions of this Order shall in no way affect or be deemed to affect the limits of any area heretofore determined by any Order to be the area of charge upon which any special expenses as defined by Section 232 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, or any other expenses directed by any Act to be defrayed as such special expenses are and shall be chargeable.

(2) The Order made by the Ministry of Health and Local Government on the 1st day of April, 1947, is hereby revoked.
