GENERAL ORDER.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in pursuance of the powers vested in it by the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1923, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders and directs as follows, that is to say:—

1. The following paragraph shall be added to and be read with Article 82 of the Public Bodies Order, 1904.

Every Collection District within a Rural District shall be so formed so that in no case shall a district electoral division be divided.

2. This Order shall come into operation and have effect for the purpose of the collection of Poor Rate in every County in Northern Ireland for the financial year ending the 31st day of March, 1925, and may be cited as the Public Bodies Order, 1924, and shall be construed as one with the Public Bodies Order, 1904.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894, the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the several Statutes and Orders in that behalf, and upon application by the County Council of the County of Down, We do hereby make the following Order:—

The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Down, between the 1st day of March, 1924, and the 1st day of August, and between the

1st day of March and the 1st day of August in the four subsequent years:

Buzzard, Chough, Crossbill, Goldfinch, Harrier (all species), Kingfisher, Peregrine Falcon, Raven, Siskin, Swan, Tern (all species), Gull (all species), Owl (all species), Kestrel.

And the taking or destroying of the Eggs of all species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Islands forming part of the said Administrative County between the same dates, during the same period.

The Order of His Grace the Governor of Northern Ireland dated 10th January, 1924, is hereby cancelled.

(b) Claims by British nationals against the Austrian Government, with the payment of which the property, rights and interests within His Majesty's Dominions or Protectorates belonging to nationals of the former Austrian Empire at the date when the said Treaty came into force (not being property, rights, or interests acquired under any general licence issued by or on behalf of His Majesty) and the net proceeds of their sale, liquidation, or other dealings therewith are charged by Article 1 (IX) of the above-mentioned Orders in Council

must be made upon the prescribed Forms, and lodged with this Department in order to rank for payment of the third dividend to be declared by me out of the funds in my hands arising from the liquidation of the above-mentioned property, rights, and interests belonging to nationals of the former Austrian Empire, or received by me from the Austrian Clearing Office under paragraph 11 of the Annex to Article 248 of the above-mentioned Treaty in pursuance of the Note of His Majesty's Government to the Austrian Government of the 27th August, 1920, published in the "London Gazette" on the 15th October, 1920 (No. 32886), or arising out of any other available property.

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS, 1882 to 1919.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO ELECTRICITY COMMISSIONERS, NORTHERN IRELAND, FOR A SPECIAL ORDER.

(Power to extend area of supply of Electrical energy so as to include the Townlands of Ballyfinaghy and Ballygammon in the County of Antrim: incorporation and repeal of Acts and other provisions).

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Belfast, acting by the Council, intend to apply to the Electricity Commissioners, Northern Ireland, for a Special Order under the above Acts for all or some of the following, amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

To add to the area of supply of Electrical Energy for the purpose of the Belfast Electric Lighting Order, 1890, as extended by the Belfast Corporation Act, 1896, the area described in the First Schedule hereto (therein and hereinafter referred to as "the added area").

To authorise the Undertakers specially to break up the streets or parts of streets in the added area not repairable by the Local Authority and the Railway which are mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto.

To define the streets and parts of streets in the added area throughout which the Undertakers are to lay down suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purposes of general supply within a period of two years after the commencement of said Order as mentioned in Sub-section (1) of Section 21 of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto.

To fix the maximum prices which may be charged by the Undertakers as provided by Section 32 of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

To authorise the Undertakers to supply electricity in the added area at a declared pressure different from that declared in the County Borough of Belfast and to vary such declared pressure.

To incorporate with the said Special Order all or some of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, and the Belfast Electric Lighting Order, 1890, and to repeal certain of the provisions contained in said last-mentioned Order and to confer other rights and privileges necessary for carrying the objects of said Special Order into force.

And Notice is hereby further given that every local or other public authority, company or person being desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the said application may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary to the said Commissioners, Ministry of Commerce, Belfast, and despatched within thirty days from this date and that a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the undersigned solicitor for the Order.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

MAXIMUM PRICES.

In this Schedule the expression "unit" shall mean the energy contained in a current of one thousand amperes flowing under an electro-motive force of one volt during one hour.

SECTION 1.

Where the Undertakers charge any consumer by the actual amount of energy supplied to him they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates per quarter:—

(a) Within the County Borough of Belfast—

For any amount up to twenty units thirteen shillings and four pence and for each unit over twenty units eightpence;

(b) Within the added area—

For any amount up to twenty units sixteen shillings and eightpence and for each unit over twenty units tenpence.

SECTION 2.

Where the Undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity contained in the supply given to him they shall be entitled to charge him according to the rates set forth in Section 1 of this Schedule the amount of energy supplied to him being taken to be the product of such electrical quantity and the declared pressure at the consumer's terminals that is to say such a constant pressure at those terminals as may be declared by the Undertakers under the regulations of the Electricity Commissioners.

To the General Widows' and Orphans' Fund of the said Reformed Presbyterian Church of Ireland the sum of £25 by deceased's Will dated 31st October, 1904, and a further sum of £25 by the first Codicil thereto dated 10th February, 1913. The receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of said Fund to be a sufficient discharge to her Executors therefor.

And the said Testatrix appointed Messrs. William Henry and John Henry, of Carrowlaverty, Armoy, Co. Antrim, and John Henry Boreland, of Lisnagunag, Bushmills, Co. Antrim, Trustees and Executors of said Will and Codicils. The said Testatrix died on or about the 10th August, 1923, and her said Will and Codicils were duly proved by the said Trustees and Executors, and Probate thereof was granted to them forth of the Principal Registry of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland on the 18th December, 1923.
