DUNCAN BLACK, M.B., B.Ch.

WHEREAS the Minister of Home Affairs had reason to suspect that Duncan Black, M.B., B.Ch., 44 Westland Bungalows, Westland Road, Belfast, a duly qualified medical practitioner, had brought himself within the provisions of paragraph (3) of Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1938:

And Whereas the said Minister of Home Affairs did refer the matter to a Tribunal duly constituted on the 30th December, 1948, in accordance with the provisions of the said Regulations:

And Whereas the Tribunal, after hearing the evidence, did recommend on the 28th January, 1949, that the said Minister of Home Affairs should withdraw the authority of the said Duncan Black to supply, procure, or be in possession of drugs or preparations and did further recommend that the said Minister of Home Affairs should direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Duncan Black to give

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Edmond Warnock, K.C., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1938, do hereby withdraw from the said Duncan Black the authority conferred by the said Regulations upon him to supply, procure, or be in possession of drugs or preparations.

And I do hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Duncan Black to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1938.
