GOVERNMENT OF NORTHERN IRELAND

DRAINAGE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice in pursuance of Section 5(1)(b) of the Drainage Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, that a scheme has been prepared for the better drainage of the Clonmakate River and certain parts of its tributaries the Derrycor and the Gallrock Rivers, in the County of Armagh, which the Drainage Council have declared to be main watercourses within the meaning of Section 1 (1) of the Act.

The watercourses to be dealt with under the Scheme are:—

- (a) The Clonmakate River which flows from the junction of the Derrycor and Gallrock Tributaries in Derrycaw, Clonmakate and Gallrock Townlands to Lough Neagh between the townland of Clonmakate and the townlands of Derrycaw, Derrylifeagh and Derrycaw.
- (b) That part of the Derrycor River which flows from Black Rampart Bridge in Eglish and Derrycor townlands to its junction with the Clonmakate River in Derrycaw, Clonmakate and Gallrock townlands between the townlands of Eglish, Clonmacash, Gallrock and Derrycor, Derrycaw.
- (c) That part of the Gallrock River which flows from Union Bridge between Clonmacash and Cloncarrish townlands to its junction with the Clonmakate River in Derrycaw, Clonmakate and Gallrock townlands, between the townlands of Cloncarrish, Ballynarry, Clonmakate and Clonmacash, Gallrock.

DRAINAGE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice in pursuance of Section 5(1)(b) of the Drainage Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, that a scheme has been prepared for the better drainage of the Tall River in the County of Armagh, which the Drainage Council have declared to be a main watercourse within the meaning of Section 1 (1) of the Act.

The part of the watercourse to be dealt with under the Scheme is:—That part of the Tall River which flows from a point, approximately two miles upstream of Drumard Bridge, in the townland of Drumnahunshin, to a point approximately one-half mile downstream of Tullyroan Bridge in the townland of Tullyroan, through or between the townlands of Drumnahunshin, Drumard (Jones), Clonroot, Annaboe, Drumard (Primate), Lurgancot, Grange Lower, Annagora, Cusheny, Aghanergill, Drummannon, Derryloughan, Fernagreevagh, Dressogagh, Cranagile, Derrycrow, Ardress East, Ardress West, Causanagh, Clonmain, Annasamry, Tullyroan and Derrycor South.

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THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND

THE ILLEGITIMATE CHILDREN (AFFILIATION ORDERS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1924

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sub-section (5) of Section eight of the Illegitimate Children (Affiliation Orders) Act (Northern Ireland), 1924, hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. The following proviso shall be added to Rule 3 of the Affiliation Orders (Payment of Collecting Officers) Order, 1925, as substituted by the Affiliation Orders (Payment of Collecting Officers) Amendment Order, 1932:—

Provided that where the Collecting Officer is a person other than a Clerk of Petty Sessions, the remuneration and expenses payable to him shall be such sum, not exceeding ten per cent. of the money actually paid through him in pursuance of Affiliation Orders, as may be fixed from time to time by the Ministry.

2. These Rules may be cited as the Affiliation Orders (Payment of Collecting Officers) Rules, 1949.

AGRICULTURAL RETURNS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1939
