COMPENSATION FOR ENEMY ACTION. FINAL DATE FOR BELATED CLAIMS.

The Board of Trade announce that, as was stated in the House of Commons on the 18th March, the Government propose to ask Parliament to authorise payment of an amount not exceeding £300,000 for the purpose of distributing a solatium to claimants who have not received any payment from the £5,000,000 fund distributed by the Royal Commission on Compensation for Suffering and Damage by Enemy Action, on account of delay in notifying claims or furnishing the necessary particulars.

Attention is particularly directed to the fact that all claims not already lodged must be received by the 1st June, 1924, at the Reparation Claims Department, Cornwall House, Stamford Street, London, S.E.1, and no claim not received by that date will be considered.

THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

RURAL DISTRICT OF LISNASKEA.

To the Council of the Administrative County of Fermanagh; to the Commissioner appointed to exercise and perform all the powers and duties of the District Council of the Rural District of Lisnaskea; and to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1896, as adapted, it is enacted in effect that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as the Ministry), may, on the application of the Sanitary Authority of any rural district, by Order to be published in the Belfast Gazette, or in any other manner as the said Ministry may direct, declare any provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Acts, 1878 to 1890, in force in Urban Districts to be in force in such Rural District or any contributory place therein, and may invest such authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Authority under those Acts, and that such investment may be made either unconditionally or subject to any conditions to be specified by the Ministry, as to the time, portion of the district, or manner, during at, and in which such powers, rights, duties, liabilities, capacities, and obligations are to be exercised and attach:

And whereas it is enacted by Section 22 of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, that all Urban Sanitary Authorities shall be called Urban District Councils, and that for every Rural Sanitary District there shall be a Rural District Council whose district shall be called a Rural District:

And whereas it is enacted by sub-section (1) of Section 33 of the said Local Government Act that there shall be transferred to the District Council of every Rural District the business of the Rural Sanitary Authority in the District:

And whereas it is enacted in effect by Section 232 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, as adapted, that special expenses (as defined in the said Section 232) shall be (amongst others) the expenses of lighting where duly authorised; that special expenses shall be a separate charge on some contributory place or places; that a townland is a contributory place; and that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland shall have power to determine on what area of charge, being a contributory place, or consisting of contributory places, any special expenses shall be chargeable:

And whereas the Council of the Rural District of Lisnaskea was dissolved by an Order made by the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, bearing date the 8th day of May, 1922, made in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Local Government (Emergency Powers) Act, 1921 (Northern Ireland), and by said Order Major James Rosborough (hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioner") was appointed to exercise and perform all the powers and duties of the said Council:

And whereas the Commissioner has made application to the Ministry under the said Section 1 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1896, for an Order declaring the provisions of Section 80 of the said Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, in force in Urban Districts, to be in force in the said Rural Districts:

Now therefore the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Public Health (Ireland) Acts, 1878 to 1919, as adapted, and by all other statutes in this behalf enabling the Ministry hereby orders, declares, and determines as follows, that is to say:—

1. The provisions of Section 80 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, are declared to be in force within the area consisting of the Townlands of Aghagay, Gortgommon and Lurganboy in the Rural District of Lisnaskea, and subject to any conditions which the Ministry may hereafter deem fit to specify in the matter, and to the provisions as to rating in Rural Districts of the Local Government (Northern Ireland) Acts, 1898 to 1923, the Council of the Rural District of Lisnaskea and the Commissioner are hereby invested with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities and obligations of an Urban District Council under Section 80 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, to be exercised and attach within the limits or boundaries of the aforesaid area.

2. The Townlands of Aghagay, Gortgommon and Lurganboy are hereby determined to be the area of charge upon which all expenses incurred by the Council or the Rural District of Lisnaskea or the Commissioner in carrying out the provisions of Section 80 of the said Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, within the said area shall be chargeable.
