MASTER AND SERVANT.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION, INDUSTRIAL DISEASES.

The Workmen's Compensation (Industrial Diseases) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1924, Dated March 27, 1924, made by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland under Section 8 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, (6 Edw. 7, c. 58) and pursuant to the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the several Orders made thereunder.

In pursuance of the power conferred by section 8, sub-section 6, of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, and by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the several Orders made thereunder, the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland hereby makes the following Order :—

1. The provisions of section 8 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, shall extend and apply to the diseases or injuries and processes specified in the first and second columns of the Schedule annexed to this Order, as if the said diseases or injuries were included in the first column of the Third Schedule to the Act, and as if the said processes were set opposite in the second column of that Schedule

to the diseases or injuries to which they are set opposite in the second column of the Schedule annexed hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Workmen's Compensation (Industrial Diseases) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1924, and shall come into force on 1st May, 1924.

TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

HAT, CAP AND MILLINERY TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established under the powers vested in the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland and in pursuance of Section 8 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the enactments modified and adapted by the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments), (No. 3) Order, 1921, and any other Order of His Majesty in Council made under the said Act of 1920 for those branches of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade as defined in the Regulations of the said Ministry, dated second day of January, 1922, hereby give notice that they propose to vary and to cancel minimum rates of wages for Female Workers employed in the Retail Branch of the trade.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the proposed variation and cancellation of rates will be given, if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to their Proposals which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the eleventh day of April, 1924. Such Objection should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Boards, 14 Bridge Street, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making Objections should state precisely, and, as far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
