TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

LINEN AND COTTON HANDKERCHIEF AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND LINEN PIECE GOODS TRADE BOARD.

(Northern Ireland).

The Trade Board established under the powers vested in the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, and in pursuance of Section 8 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the enactments modified and adapted by the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments), (No. 3) Order, 1921, and any other Order of His Majesty in Council made under the said Act of 1920, for

those branches of the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade, as defined in the Regulations of the said Ministry, dated Second day of January, 1922, hereby give notice that they propose to vary minimum rates of wages for certain classes of Male Workers employed in the trade.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the proposed variations will be given, if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to their proposals which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the Third day of May, 1924, Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade Board (Northern Ireland), 14 Bridge Street, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making Objections should state precisely, and, as far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
