NOTE.—The cost of Reserved Services and the contribution towards Imperial Expenditure are deducted from the proceeds of Reserved Taxes. The net sum due, viz., the Residuary Share of Reserved Taxes, is paid over to the Northern Government by the Imperial Treasury one month in arrear; but in respect of the month of March a payment based on the best estimate available was made within that month. The above figures refer only to the small balance paid over in April.
