
ULSTER SAVINGS CERTIFICATES THIRD ISSUE

The Ministry of Finance, in exercise of the powers vested in it by Sub-Section (1) of Section 16 of the Exchequer and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, and subject to the provisions of the Ulster Savings Certificates Regulations, 1927, as amended by any subsequent Regulations, hereby directs as follows:—

- (1) The currency of any Ulster Savings Certificate issued on or after the 1st October, 1926, and before the 7th July, 1932 (in this direction referred to as a "certificate of the Third Issue"), shall be prolonged to a date thirty years after the date of purchase of that certificate.
- (2) Interest shall be added after the twenty-third anniversary of the date of purchase and up to and including the thirtieth anniversary of that date at the rate of threepence-halfpenny in respect of each unit certificate of the Third Issue for each completed period of six months.
- (3) On the death of any holder of a certificate of the Third Issue occurring after the 1st October, 1945, the value of any such certificate held, including accrued interest, will be

- repaid to the legal personal representative, nominee, or other person entitled under the Ulster Savings Certificates Regulations, 1927, as amended by any subsequent Regulations.
- (4) For the purpose of this direction a multiple certificate shall be taken to be such number of unit certificates as is represented by that multiple certificate.

MERCHANDISE MARKS

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department, and the Secretary of State for Scotland, on 25th May, 1950, made the following Directions under Section 3 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926:—

1. The Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 1) 1950, which suspends for a period of twelve months from the date of the Direction the operation of the provisions of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 5 Order, 1928, in relation to imported currants, sultanas and raisins.
2. The Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 2) 1950, which suspends for a period of twelve months from the date of the Direction the operation of the provisions of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 1 Order, 1932, in relation to imported butter.
3. The Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 3) 1950, which suspends for a period of twelve months from the date of the Direction the operation of the provisions of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 3 Order, 1934, in relation to imported bacon and ham.

4. The Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 4) 1950, which suspends for a period of twelve months from the date of the Direction the operation of the provisions of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 5 Order, 1934, in relation to imported dead poultry.

5. The Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 5) 1950, which suspends for a period of twelve months from the date of the Direction the operation of the provisions of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 7 Order, 1934, as amended by the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 7 Order, 1934, Amendment Order, 1936, in relation to imported chilled beef, frozen mutton, frozen lamb, frozen pork, frozen beef, frozen veal, boneless beef, boneless veal, salted beef, salted pork, or edible offals.

RATES OF INTEREST ON GOVERNMENT LOANS

Pursuant to Section 1(7)(a) of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, the Ministry of Finance hereby gives notice that the undermentioned rates of interest shall be chargeable on loans or instalments of loans of the following descriptions advanced from the Government Loans Fund, on or after the 30th June, 1950, namely:—

I. LOCAL OR PUBLIC LOANS

(a) Loans to Local Authorities, as defined in Section 11(2) of the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, being loans secured on Local Rates: Loans for periods not exceeding 15 years— $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

Loans for periods exceeding 15 years—3 per cent.

(b) Loans to other Public Authorities, as defined in paragraph 1(a) of the First Schedule to the Government Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1939:

Loans for periods not exceeding 25 years— $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

Loans for periods exceeding 25 but not exceeding 50 years— $3\frac{3}{4}$ per cent.

II. LAND AND WORKS LOANS

Loans to Civil Servants for the purchase or erection of houses for their accommodation, and other Land and Works Loans:—

Loans for periods not exceeding 25 years— $3\frac{5}{8}$ per cent.

Loans for periods exceeding 25 but not exceeding 35 years— $3\frac{3}{4}$ per cent.

III. EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT LOANS

(a) Loans for the purchase, erection, extension, or alteration of school buildings (not being schools in respect of which local or public loans may be made):

Loans for periods not exceeding 25 years— $3\frac{3}{8}$ per cent.

Loans for periods exceeding 25 but not exceeding 50 years— $3\frac{3}{4}$ per cent.

(b) Loans for the equipment of such schools as aforesaid:

Loans for periods not exceeding 10 years— $3\frac{3}{8}$ per cent.

IV. OTHER LOANS

The rates of interest to be charged on loans other than those defined in Parts I, II, and III of this Notice will be determined by the Ministry of Finance according to the circumstances of each individual case.

METHOD OF REPAYMENT

Local and Public Loans as defined in Part I of this Notice will be repayable as the Ministry of Finance may determine, either (i) by equal half-yearly instalments of the principal advanced, together with interest on the balance of principal from time to time outstanding, or (ii) by equal half-yearly instalments of annuities calculated to include interest at the rates specified.

Loans defined in Parts II and III of this Notice will normally be repayable by equal half-yearly instalments of annuities calculated to include interest at the rates specified.

Other loans will be repayable by such methods as the Ministry of Finance may determine according to the circumstances.
