To the Treasurer for the time being of the Presbyterian Orphan Society the sum of Five hundred pounds Upon Trust, to invest the same and apply the income thereof towards the work of the said Society in Northern Ireland.

To the Treasurer for the time being of the Zenana Mission in connection with the Presbyterian Church in Ireland the sum of One hundred pounds Upon Trust, to invest the same and apply the income thereof towards the said Mission.

The Testator by his said Will, after making certain other pecuniary bequests, devised and bequeathed all the rest, residue and remainder of his property of every kind in equal shares to the Treasurers for the time being of the Presbyterian Orphan Society, the Foreign Mission in connection with the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, and the Mission of the Secession Church in Seonia, India, Upon Trust, to be applied by them in the same manner as the Legacies hereinbefore bequeathed to them respectively.
