PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1937 AND 1948

The Ministry of Health and Local Government gives notice, in pursuance of the above named Regulations, that it hereby recognises the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat from which the meat product to which the Certificate relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministry, and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the preparing and packing of the meat product.

The Certificate being in the form of a label or stamp, recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to, or the stamp is clearly impressed on, the package containing the meat product and the label or stamp has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

UNITED KINGDOM HERBAGE SEEDS MARKETING SCHEME PUBLIC INQUIRY

FACTORIES ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938 AND 1949

HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance hereby gives notice that on the 19th December, 1950, it made, under Sections 18, 47 and 65 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, Section 8 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, and the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938 (Extension of Section 47) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948, the Building Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950, which deal with the health, safety and welfare of persons employed on building operations.

The Regulations supersede the Building Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1926 and 1932. They provide a code of rules for operations of the kind described in Regulation 2, which includes the construction, structural alteration, repair or maintenance

of a building, the demolition of a building, and the preparation for, and laying the foundation of, an intended building. The revoked Regulations were confined to premises on which power-driven machinery was temporarily used for the construction of a building or for any addition to the structure of an existing building. The present Regulations are not limited in this way, and also contain in Part VI new provisions about health and welfare.
