BY THE KING A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING A DESIGN FOR A CUPRO-NICKEL COIN OF THE REALM

GEORGE R

Whereas under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to deter-

mine the design for any coin:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine a design, hereinafter specified, for the cupronickel Crown, being one of the cupronickel coins mentioned in the Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1946, to be struck at Our Mint in London during the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty one in commemoration of the Festival of Britain and of the four hundredth anniversary of the striking of the first

nundredth anniversary of the striking of the first English silver Crown:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

1. The design for the cupro-nickel Crown to be struck at Our Mint in London during the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one shall be as follows:

Every Crown shall have for the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D: G: BR: OMN: REX F: D:", together with the words "FIVE SHILLINGS", and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year "1951", and upon the edge in incuse letters the inscription "MDCCCLI CIVIUM INDUSTRIA FLORET CIVITAS MCMLI'

This Proclamation shall come into force on

GIVEN at Our Court at Bucking-ham Palace, this 15th day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty one, and in the Fifteenth year of Our Reign.

WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945

SHIRTMAKING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND)

The Shirtmaking Wages Council (Northern Ireland), hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, proposals for the revocation of the Shirtmaking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1948 (S.R. & O. 1948, No. 224) and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration at present payable.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above mentioned presentations with respect to the above mentioned proposals, which may be sent to it within twenty-one days from 23rd March, 1951.
