WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945

BAKING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND)

The Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance proposals for (1) the revocation of the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 4) Order, 1949 (S.R. & O. 1949, No. 219), and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration at present payable and (2) for the amendment of the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 1) Order, 1951 (S.R. & O. 1951, No. 16) and the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order, 1951 (S.R. & O. 1951, No. 22).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained from the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within twenty-one days from 30th March, 1951. Any such representation should be signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address) and sent to the Secretary, Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland). The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby announce that they have made an Order under Section 21(1) of the Finance Act, 1948, namely the Purchase Tax (No. 4) Order, 1951.

The Order substitutes a new group 30 in Part I of the eighth Schedule to the Finance Act, 1948.

The bulk of hairdressing articles and preparations are now brought within this Group and are, with the exception of those mentioned below, charged at 100 per cent. Most of the articles and preparations charged at 100 per cent. were already charged at that rate under Group 31 (toilet requisities) or Group 32 (perfumery and toilet preparations), but the higher rate is now also applied to some articles and preparations which, either singly or in assemblies, were not chargeable or only chargeable at a lower rate.

The existing rate of 33\frac{1}{3} per cent, is preserved for hair waving and drying machines and for those articles which are chargeable at that rate under Group 4 (Haberdashery). Group 31 (b) (brushes, combs, etc.) or Group 32 (b) (ii) (soap, shampoos, etc.). Appliances designed for heating the hair in the process of waving, curling, etc., are also chargeable at 33\frac{1}{3} per cent.

MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND

POISONS

The Minister of Home Affairs has made the Poison Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1951, to come into force on the 1st day of April, 1951.

These Regulations impose control on certain poisons which have been added to the Poisons Schedule of the Medicines, Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, by a recent Order in Council.

They also deal with the quantities of poisons in ampoules.
