NOTICE is hereby given that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by sub-section (1) of Section 126 and sub-section (2) of Section 134 of the Children and Young Persons Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, has made the Training Schools (Contributions by Local Authorities) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1951 (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1951, No. 40).

POISONS

The Minister of Home Affairs has made the Poison Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1951, to come into force on the 1st day of April, 1951.

These Regulations impose control on certain poisons which have been added to the Poisons Schedule of the Medicines, Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, by a recent Order in Council.

They also deal with the quantities of poisons in ampoules.
