WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945

BRUSH AND BROOM WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND)

The Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland hereby give notice of an Open Competition for the situation of Ordnance Survey Assistant Grade III to be held in Belfast under the Regulations published in the "Belfast Gazette" on the 5th June, 1948, and amended as follows:—

"3. Nationality.

Candidates must be natural-born or naturalized British subjects. They must also:—

- (a) have been born in Northern Ireland; or
- (b) have been ordinarily resident

- (i) in the United Kingdom since the 3rd September, 1939; or

Candidates may be exempted from complying with the above requirements as to nationality and/or residence in exceptional circumstances and where the Commissioners are satisfied that it is in the interests of the public service to grant such an exemption.

Loans for periods not exceeding 25 years, 4 per cent;

Loans for periods exceeding 25 but not exceeding 50 years, 4½ per cent.

II. LAND AND WORKS LOANS

Loans to Civil Servants for the purchase or erection of houses for their accommodation and other Land and Works Loans:—

Loans for periods not exceeding 25 years, 4 per cent.

Loans for periods exceeding 25 but not exceeding 35 years, 4½ per cent.

III. EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT LOANS

- (a) Loans for the purchase, erection, extension, or alteration of school buildings (not being schools in respect of which local or public loans may be made):—

Loans for periods not exceeding 25 years, 4 per cent;

Loans for periods exceeding 25 but not exceeding 50 years, 4½ per cent.

- (b) Loans for the equipment of such schools as aforesaid:—

Loans for periods not exceeding 10 years, 4 per cent.

IV. OTHER LOANS

The rates of interest to be charged on loans other than those defined in Parts I, II, and III of this Notice will be determined by the Ministry of Finance according to the circumstances of each individual case.
