HEALTH SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948

NOTICE is hereby given that in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, the Ministry of Health and Local Government has made Regulations, dated 28th September, 1951, entitled the Health Services (Sup-

plementary Eye Services) (Qualifications) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1951.

These Regulations amend the Health Services (Supplementary Eye Services) (Qualifications) Regulations, 1948, by prescribing fresh qualifications for medical practitioners providing supplementary eye services under Section 22 of the Health Services Act. Nothing in these Regulations affects the position of practitioners who are already providing such services.

IN THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE IN NORTHERN IRELAND

KING'S BENCH DIVISION—IN BANKRUPTCY

In the Matter of David Cosgrove and Samuel Cosgrove, both of Ballygorman, in the County of Armagh, Farmers, Bankrupts.
