EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875

Whereas Sergeant Charles Thompson (No. 3334), of the Royal Ulster Constabulary was on the 5th August, 1949, appointed to be an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the Explosives Act, 1875:

Now I, The Right Honourable Brian Maginess, K.C., M.P., being the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in virtue of the power conferred on me by Section 53 of the said Act and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the said Sergeant Charles Thompson shall from this day cease to exercise the powers and perform the duties of an Inspector under the said Act.
