STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS OF NORTHERN IRELAND, 1952, No. 9

POISONS

Order in Council, dated 30th January, 1952, approving a resolution passed by the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland and the Medical Faculty of the Queen's University of Belfast, amending the Third Schedule to the Medicines, Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1945.

BY THE GOVERNOR IN THE PRIVY COUNCIL OF
NORTHERN IRELAND

GRANVILLE

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section twenty-six of the Medicines, Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1945 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland and the Medical Faculty of the Queen's University, Belfast, may from time to time, by a resolution passed by both of these bodies, declare that the Third

Schedule to the said Act ought to be amended by including in, or removing from, any part thereof any substance specified in the resolution, or by transferring any substance so specified from one part of the said Schedule to another part.

AND WHEREAS the said Council and the said Medical Faculty, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers vested in them by the said sub-section (2) of section twenty-six of the Act, did, on the 21st day of September, 1951, and on the 23rd day of October, 1951, respectively, resolve and declare that the Third Schedule to the Act ought to be amended as follows:—

1. In Part I of the Third Schedule to the Act:—

(a) In the item commencing with the words "Anti-histamine substances", after the word "Antazoline" there shall be inserted the word "Chlorcyclizine", and after the word "Phenindamine" there shall be inserted the word "Promethazine";

(b) After the item "Erythrityl tetranitrate" there shall be inserted the words "Gallamine, its compounds";

(c) In the item commencing with the words "Mercury, oxides of" after the words "potassio-mercuric iodides" there shall be inserted the words "organic compounds of mercury which contain a methyl (CH₃) group directly linked to the mercury atom."

(d) After the item commencing with the word "Para-amino-benzoic acid" there shall be inserted the item "Paramethadione."

2. In Part II of the said Third Schedule after the words "Mercury; organic compounds of" there shall be inserted the words "except compounds which contain a methyl (CH₃) group directly linked to the mercury atom."

AND WHEREAS the said resolution has been duly submitted by the Minister of Home Affairs for the approval of the Governor in the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (3) of the said section twenty-six of the said Act, and whereas it is expedient that the

said resolution should be approved as required by the said sub-section (3).

NOW, THEREFORE, I, William Spencer, Earl Granville, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Vice-Admiral, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the consent of the Privy Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said sub-section (3) do hereby approve of the said resolution.

NOTICE OF RULE

Whereas it hath pleased Almighty God to call to His mercy our late Sovereign Lord King George the Sixth of Blessed and Glorious Memory by whose Decease the Crown is solely and rightfully come to the High and Mighty Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary: We, therefore, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal of this Realm, being here assisted with these of His late Majesty's Privy Council, with representatives of other members of the Commonwealth, with other Principal Gentlemen of Quality, with the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of London, do now hereby with one voice and Consent of Tongue and Heart publish and proclaim that the High and Mighty Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary is now, by the Death of our late Sovereign of Happy Memory, become Queen Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God Queen of this Realm and of all Her other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, to whom Her lieges do acknowledge all Faith and constant Obedience, with hearty and humble Affection; beseeching God, by whom Kings and Queens do reign, to bless the Royal Princess Elizabeth the Second with long and happy Years to reign over us.

The Justices for the government of Northern Ireland and members of the Privy Council signified their approval to a Proclamation requiring all Mayors, Sheriffs and other His Majesty's Officers to publish and proclaim Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second.

A number of persons of quality who had been invited by Their Excellencies to be present were admitted to the Council Chamber.

The Justices for the government of Northern Ireland and members of the Privy Council signified their approval to a Proclamation acknowledging Queen Elizabeth the Second to be our only lawful and rightful Queen. The Proclamation thereafter lay on the table for signature by the other persons present.

A PROCLAMATION

WE, the Justices for the government of Northern Ireland and Council, do by this Our Proclamation, think fit to give Public Notice thereof to all Her Majesty's subjects; and to require that at the steps of the City Hall, Belfast, and at the steps of the Guildhall, Londonderry, a Gentleman of the Governor's Household, and elsewhere all Mayors, Sheriffs, and all others Her Majesty's Officers, in all the Cities and Towns Corporate, and Market Places, in Northern Ireland, shall publish and proclaim That the High and Mighty Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary is now, by the Death of our late Sovereign of Happy Memory, become Queen Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God Queen of this Realm and of Her other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith; and all Officers both Civil and Military and other Her Majesty's subjects, are hereby required to be assisting in the performance thereof with all due solemnity.

Her Majesty, being this day present in
Council, was pleased to make the following
Declaration:—

"Your Royal Highnesses, My Lords, Ladies
and Gentlemen:

By the sudden death of my dear Father,
I am called to assume the duties and
responsibilities of Sovereignty.

At this time of deep sorrow, it is a
profound consolation to me to be assured
of the sympathy which you and all my
Peoples feel towards me, to my Mother,
and my Sister, and to the other members
of my Family. My Father was our revered
and beloved Head, as he was of the wider

Family of his subjects; the grief which his
loss brings is shared among us all.

My heart is too full for me to say more
to you to-day than that I shall always
work, as my Father did throughout his
Reign, to uphold constitutional government
and to advance the happiness and prosper-
ity of my Peoples, spread as they are
all the world over. I know that in my
resolve to follow his shining example of
service and devotion, I shall be inspired
by the loyalty and affection of those whose
Queen I have been called to be, and by
the counsel of their elected Parliaments. I
pray that God will help me to discharge
worthily this heavy task that has been laid
upon me so early in my life."

Whereupon the Lords of the Council made
it their humble request to Her Majesty that
Her Majesty's Most Gracious Declaration to
Their Lordships might be made public, which
Her Majesty was pleased to Order
accordingly.
