#### WHITE FISH AUTHORITY

SEA FISH INDUSTRY ACT. 1951

Notice of Registration of Wholesale Merchants REGULATIONS, 1952

- The White Fish Authority hereby given notice that, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the above Act, it is their intention to make Regulations which will come into operation on the 21st day of April, 1952, and which will provide for (inter alia):
  - the registration by the Authority of persons engaging in the white fish industry by carrying on the business of a wholesale merchant other than a wholesale merchant who sells only at first hand;
  - the payment to the Authority of a registra-tion fee of 5/- and the furnishing of information required for the purposes of registration.
