For the purposes of (b) any period of absence from Northern Ireland or other part of the United Kingdom on National Service, whether in H.M. Forces or otherwise, will be disregarded.

Candidates may be exempted from complying with the above requirements as to nationality and/or residence in exceptional circumstances and where the Commissioners are satisfied that it is in the interests of the public service to grant an exemption.

7. ASSIGNMENT

The Commissioners will decide the Departments to which successful candidates are to be assigned. In making the assignments they will be guided by the requirements of the public service, and candidates may be required to serve anywhere in Northern Ireland. A candidate who does not accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment.

No person will be admitted to the Competition from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received on or before the 16th December, 1952, an application in the candidate's handwriting on the prescribed form.
