## THERAPEUTIC SUBSTANCES (PREVENTION OF MISUSE) ACT, 1953

### THE THERAPEUTIC SUBSTANCES (SUPPLY OF ANTIBIOTICS FOR AGRICULTURAL PURPOSES) REGULATIONS, 1953

Whereas Regulation 4 of the Therapeutic Substances (Supply of Antibiotics for Agricultural Purposes) Regulations, 1953, made by virtue of the Therapeutic Substances (Prevention of Misuse) Act, 1953, provides that no penicillin supplement or aureomycin supplement shall be sold or supplied in Northern Ireland for mixing with pig food or poultry food otherwise than in a container bearing a label containing in such manner as the appropriate Minister may require certain particulars, including such particulars with respect to the storage and use of the supplement as the said Minister may require:—

Now therefore I, The Reverend The Right Honourable Robert Moore, the Minister of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, being the appropriate Minister for the purposes of application of the aforesaid Regula-

tion in Northern Ireland, hereby require that any container to which that Regulation applies shall bear a label containing in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto the particulars therein indicated.

## THERAPEUTIC SUBSTANCES (PREVENTION OF MISUSE) ACT, 1953

## THE THERAPEUTIC SUBSTANCES (SUPPLY OF ANTIBIOTICS FOR AGRICULTURAL PURPOSES) REGULATIONS, 1953

Whereas Regulation 5 of the Therapeutic Substances (Supply of Antibiotics for Agricultural Purposes) Regulations, 1953, made by virtue of the Therapeutic Substances (Prevention of Misuse) Act, 1953, provides that a container of feeding stuffs containing antibiotics to which the aforesaid Regulation applies shall in Northern Ireland have affixed thereto or inserted therein a label containing in such manner as the appropriate Minister may require such particulars with respect to the number of units of aureomycin or penicillin added to the feeding stuff and such particulars with respect to the storage and use of the feeding stuff as he may require:—

Now, therefore I, The Reverend The Right Honourable Robert Moore, the Minister of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, being the appropriate Minister for the purposes of application of the aforesaid Regulation in Northern Ireland, hereby require that any container to which that Regulation applies shall have affixed thereto or inserted therein a label containing in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto the particulars therein indicated.

## AMENDMENTS OF THE BRITISH PHARMACOPOEIA, 1953

A document, entitled Amendments of the British Pharmacopoeia, 1953, containing these amendments is printed as authorised by the Council by Percy Lund Humphries and Company, Limited, of the Country Press, Bradford, and is published on behalf of the Council by the Pharmaceutical Press, of 17 Bloomsbury Square, London, W.C.1 In pursuance of sub-Section (3) of the said Section 23 the Council have fixed the first day of September, 1953, being the date as from which the British Pharmacopoeia, 1953, is to have effect, as the date as from which the amendments thereof now published are to have effect.

## STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS

### THERAPEUTIC SUBSTANCES

The under-mentioned Regulations which have been made jointly by the Minister of Health, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Minister of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland, apply to the United Kingdom.

1953, No. 1172—The Therapeutic Substances Amendment Regulations, 1953.

These Regulations bring aureomycin or preparations containing it, when intended for parenteral injection, under the control of the Therapeutic Substances Act, 1925, as substances the purity or potency of which cannot be adequately tested by chemical means. The effect is that they may not be manufactured for sale or imported without a licence (obtainable in Northern Ireland from the Ministry of Health and Local Government, Stormont, Belfast).

1953, No. 1173—The Therapeutic Substances (Control of Isoniazid) Regulations, 1953.

These Regulations bring isoniazid within the scope of the Penicillin Act, 1947, which controls the sale and supply of the substances to which it applies.

1953, No. 1174—The Therapeutic Substances (Supply of Antibiotics for Agricultural Purposes) Regulations, 1953.

These Regulations have the effect of removing the restrictions imposed by sub-Section (1) of Section 1 of the Penicillin Act, 1947, on the sale of feeding stuffs containing antibiotics and of certain forms of aureomycin or penicillin intended for use as supplements to pig or poultry foods. As a safeguard against danger to health the Regulations limit the quantities of these antibiotics which may be included in the feeding stuffs and provide for the proper labelling of containers.
