The Order excludes floor coverings from the scope of the exemptions in Group 6(c) of Part I of the Eighth Schedule to the Finance Act, 1948, thus making it clear that the exemptions provided for certain kinds of tissues and fabrics do not apply when those tissues and fabrics are made into floor coverings (e.g., certain coir and jute matting).
