A PROCLAMATION

Determining new Inscriptions for Gold, Silver, Cupro-Nickel, Mixed Metal and Bronze Coins.

**ELIZABETH R.**

WHEREAS under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advise of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable, in consequence of Our Proclamation dated the twenty-eighth day of May, 1953, appointing and declaring the form of Our Style and Titles to be used, so far as conveniently may be, in relation to the United Kingdom, to determine new forms of the abbreviations of Our Style and Titles on the Coins, hereinafter specified, being certain of the gold, silver and bronze coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, and of the cupro-nickel coins mentioned in the Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1946, and the coin of mixed metal mentioned in the Proclamation of Our Royal Predecessor King George VI dated the 18th day of March, 1937:

We, therefore, in pursuance of section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

The designs for the said gold, silver, cupro-nickel, mixed metal and bronze coins shall be as follows:—

**GOLD COINS**

(1) Five-Pound Piece—Every five-pound piece shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH · II · DEI · GRATIA · REGINA · F: D:" and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(2) Two-Pound Piece—Every two-pound piece shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(3) Sovereign—Every sovereign shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(4) Half-Sovereign—Every half-sovereign shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

**SILVER COINS**

The Queen's Maundy Monies—Every Maundy silver fourpence, threepence, twopence and penny shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH · II · DEI · GRATIA · REGINA · F: D:" and for the reverse the respective figures "4," "3," "2," "1" (according to the denomination or value of the piece) in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled with an oak wreath surmounted by the Crown. The coins shall have a plain edge.

**CUPRO-NICKEL COINS**

(1) Crown—Every crown shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy with the inscriptions "ELIZABETH · II · DEI · GRATIA · REGINA · F: D:" and "FIVE SHILLINGS" and for the reverse the four Quarterings of Our Royal Arms each contained in a shield and arranged in saltire with, in the intervening spaces, a Rose, a Thistle, both slipped and leaved, a sprig of Shamrock and a Leek; in the centre the Crown and in the base the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(2) Half-Crown—Every half-crown shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH · II · DEI · GRATIA · REGINA" and for the reverse a Shield of Our Royal Arms between the letters E and R and surmounted by the Crown, with the inscriptions "FID · DEF" and "HALF CROWN" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(3) Florin—Every florin shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse a double Rose within a circlet of radiating Thistles, Shamrocks and

Leeks, with the inscriptions "FID · DEF ·" and "TWO SHILLINGS" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(4) Shilling—Every shilling shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse either

(a) the Shield of that Quartering of Our Royal Arms which displays Our Three Lions Passant Guardant, surmounted by the Crown, or

(b) the Shield of that Quartering of Our Royal Arms which displays Our Tressured Lion Rampant, surmounted by the Crown, with the inscriptions "FID DEF" and "ONE SHILLING" and the date of the year placed across the shield. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(5) Sixpence—Every sixpence shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse a Rose, a Thistle, both slipped and leaved, a sprig of Shamrock and a Leek, all interlaced about the stems, with the inscriptions "FID · DEF ·" above and "SIX PENCE" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

#### COIN OF MIXED METAL

Threepence—Every threepence of mixed metal shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH · II · DEI · GRATIA · REGINA · F: D:" and for the reverse a Portcullis with chains, ensigned with a royal coronet, being a Badge of Our Royal Predecessor King Henry VII, with the date of the year between the words "THREE" and "PENNY." The coin shall have a plain edge having twelve sides.

#### BRONZE COINS

(1) Penny—Every bronze penny shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid Effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH · II · DEI · GRATIA · REGINA · F: D:" and for the reverse the figure of Britannia, seated on a rock surrounded by the sea, her right hand holding a shield which rests against the rock, while in her left hand she grasps a trident, with a Lighthouse in the distance; and the words "ONE PENNY", with the date of the year. The coin shall have a plain edge.

(2) Half-penny—Every half-penny shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the representation of a sailing ship, and the words "HALF PENNY" with the date of the year. The coin shall have a plain edge.

(3) Farthing—Every farthing shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the representation of a Wren, and the word "FARTHING" with the date of the year. The coin shall have a plain edge.

This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this Fourth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, and in the Second year of Our Reign.

**AID TO INDUSTRY ACT (N.I.), 1953**

**GOVERNMENT CONTRIBUTIONS TOWARDS THE COST OF COAL FOR MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY**

Under the Aid to Industry Act (N.I.), 1953, the Ministry of Commerce is authorised to pay contributions towards the cost incurred by certain manufacturers in the purchase of coal, gas and electricity. The regulations under which payments will be made are contained in the Aid to Industry Order (N.I.), S.R. & O. of N.I., 127 of 1953, which may be obtained from H.M. Stationery Office, Chichester Street, Belfast, or through any bookseller.

Under the Order contributions are payable to persons engaged in the manufacture of goods or in a process directly related to manufacture who normally use each year 50 tons or more of coal or the equivalent of 50 tons of coal in the form of coal, gas and electricity. For the purposes of the Order gas and electricity count as coal to the extent of the quantity of coal required by the supplying undertaking to produce the gas and electric current used.

As a first step the Ministry of Commerce will compile a register of persons who are eligible to benefit under the Act. Any person who considers that he may be eligible is invited to apply for registration on forms which may be obtained from the Ministry of Commerce, Chichester House, Belfast.
