**BAKING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND)**

The Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance proposals for the amendment of the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order, 1953 (S.R. & O., 1953, No. 77) and the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 3) Order, 1953 (S.R. & O., 1953, No. 78).

The Wages Council will consider any representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within twenty-one days from 8th January, 1954.
