### GOVERNMENT OF NORTHERN IRELAND MINISTRY OF COMMERCE

ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948

The Ministry of Commerce hereby gives notice in accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Roads Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, that it proposes to make an Order under Sections 1 and 3 of that Act, the general effect of which will be as follows:—

(1) The road proposed to be constructed by the Ministry (which road is hereinafter referred to as "the new trunk road") shall become a trunk road on the date of the coming into force of the Order. The route of the new trunk road is from a point on the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry trunk road (T.3) approximately 960 yards east of Hunt's Corner to a point on the

- said trunk road approximately 130 yards east of Verner's Bridge.
- (2) That length of the Belfast-Ballygawley-London-derry trunk road (T.3) which lies between a point approximately 960 yards east of Hunt's Corner and its junction with the new trunk road approximately 130 yards east of Verner's Bridge shall cease to be a trunk road on the first day of April next after the date on which notice is given by the Ministry that the new trunk road is opened for the purposes of through traffic.
- (3) The Ministry will be authorised:
  - (a) to construct a length of new road from a point on the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry trunk road (T.3) approximately 110 yards east of Hunt's Corner to a point on the new trunk road approximately 130 yards south-east of Hunt's Corner;
  - (b) to construct a length of new road from a point on the Belfast-Ballygawley-London-derry trunk road (T.3) at its junction with the unclassified road (DR.17) at Derrygavel to a point on the new trunk road approximately 40 yards south-west of the said junction;
  - (c) to stop up wholly the junction between the new trunk road and the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry trunk road (T.3) at a point approximately 550 yards east of Hunt's Corner:
  - (d) to stop up wholly the junction between the new trunk road and the third class road (C.167) at a point approximately 35 yards south of Hunt's Corner;
  - (e) to stop up wholly the junction between the new trunk road and the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry trunk road (T.3) at a point approximately 1,820 yards west of Hunt's Corner;
  - (f) to stop up wholly the junction between the new trunk road and the second class road (B.196) at a point adjacent to Verner's Inn.

The route of the new trunk road and details of the new roads it is proposed to construct and the junctions it is proposed to stop up are delineated on a map, a copy of which, together with a copy of the draft Order, may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period of thirty-one days from the 14th day of May, 1954, at either of the undermentioned offices:—
