NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO MAKE RULES.

THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1924.

Notice is hereby given pursuant to sub-section 1 of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, after the expiration of 40 days from the date of publication hereof, proposes to make, under the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, the Public Health Act, 1896, and the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, regulations relating to the importation of food into Northern Ireland. The object of the regulations is to consolidate, with amendments, the provisions of the Public Health (Foreign Meat) (Ireland) Regulations, 1908, the Public Health (First Series: Unsound Food) (Ireland) Regulations, 1908, and the Public Health (Foreign Meat) (Ireland) Amending Regulations, 1909.

It is intended that the new regulations should come into operation on the 1st January, 1925. Copies of the draft regulations may be obtain-

ed at the offices of the said Ministry, Ocean Buildings, Belfast.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 70 (1) of the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, to make regulations as to the investment of funds paid over to the National Debt Commissioners, whether for permanent or temporary investment, under the above Act.

Ministry of Health, London, S.W.1 Regulations dated 3rd October, 1924, made under Section 10 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, by the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as amended by Section 2 (1) of the Local Government (Financial Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1924, and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, hereby makes the following Regulations:-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Local Authorities (Parliamentary Grants) Regula-

- tions, 1924.
 (1) The Ministry of Home Affairs for (hereinafter called the Northern Ireland Ministry of Home Affairs) shall, from time to time, as occasion may require, prepare and issue a certificate showing the amount payable to or on behalf of the council of each county, county borough, county district and board of guardians of any poor law union in Northern Ireland as the equivalent of the average of the payments made out of the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account (other than those formerly paid to any county council or urban district council for the reduction of any railway or harbour charge and which are provided for in Section 2 (1) of the Local Government (Financial Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland) 1924, to or on behalf of such council or board in respect of the three financial years ended on the 31st day of March, 1918, the 31st day of March, 1919, and the 31st day of March, 1920, under the enactments set forth in the First Schedule to the Local
 - Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1923.
 (2) The certificate to be furnished by the Ministry of Home Affairs shall be prepared substantially in the form shown in the First Schedule to these Regulations and shall ascertain and apportion the amount of the grant to which the council of each county and county borough (on their own behalf or on behalf of the board of guardians of any union situated within the county) and each urban district council are entitled.

Provided, however, in the case of any union urban district or rural district area which has been altered since the financial year ended the 31st day of March, 1920, or may be hereafter altered, the Ministry of Home Affairs shall calculate the amount of the grant to which each such area as constituted in the year last-mentioned financial would entitled if its boundaries had not been altered, and the amount so calculated shall be divided in proportion to the rateable value of the sections into which the area has been or may be divided.

3. (1) The sums so certified by the Ministry of Home Affairs as aforesaid shall be payable in each year by half yearly istalments to the same local authorities (or to such other local authorities as may have succeeded to their functions) as those to whom the grants out of the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account were payable, and the names of the grants in respect thereof set out in column I of the Second Schedule to these Regulations shall hereafter be known by the names set out opposite thereto in column 2 of the said schedule.

(2) If any question shall arise as to the amounts included in any such certificate such question shall be determined by the Ministry of Home Affairs.

THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND. HOUSING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

RURAL DISTRICT OF MOIRA.

WHEREAS the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland is satisfied that there is an urgent need for houses in the area adjoining the Industrial centre of Waringstown, situate in the townlands of Magherana and Tullyherron in the rural district of Moira in the administrative county of Down, and that proper housing accommodation for the working classes cannot be secured in such area except by the making of grants under the provisions of Section 1 of the Housing Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, in respect of houses erected in the area:

And whereas the said area is defined in the Schedule to this Order and is not within one mile and a half from the boundary of the area of a local authority within the meaning of Section 6 of the aforesaid Act:

Now therefore the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers vested in it by sub-section (8) of section 1 of the Housing Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, by this Order hereby extends, subject to the proviso (b) con-

tained in the said sub-section (8) the provisions of sub-sections (1) to (7) inclusive of section 1 of the said Act to the erection of houses in the area defined in the Schedule to this Order:

And the Ministry hereby determines that the grant payable in respect of each house so constructed shall be at the rate of sixty pounds.

SCHEDULE.

Area Adjoining Industrial Centre.

The area comprised within a radius of three-quarters of a statute mile as measured in a straight line on a six-inch Ordnance sheet from Waringstown Post Office and situate in the rural district of Moira and county of Down, excluding that portion of the said area lying within a distance of one mile and a half, measured as aforesaid, from the boundary of the urban district of Lurgan, and also excluding that portion of the said area lying within a radius of one statute mile, measured as aforesaid, from Donaghcloney Post Office.
