STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS THERAPEUTIC SUBSTANCES

The under-mentioned Regulations which have been made jointly by the Minister of Health, the Secre-tary of State for Scotland and the Minister of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland, apply to the United Kingdom.

1954 No. 1645-The Therapeutic Substances Amendment Regulations, 1954.

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(a) These Regulations bring oxytetracycline and preparations thereof, when intended for parental injection, under the control of the Therapeutic Sub-stances Act, 1925. (This Act controls, by a system of licensing, the manufacture, testing, labelling, etc., of substances scheduled in the Act.)

(b) They make some minor amendments to existing Regulations.

(c) They bring up to date the technical require-ments for the manufacture and testing of insulin and take account of new forms of the substance which have recently been produced.

1954 No. 1646—The Therapeutic Substances (Con-trol of Sale and Supply) Regulations, 1954.

These Regulations bring erythromycin, neomycin, oxytetracycline, polymyxins, corticotrophin, cortisone and hydrocortisone within the scope of the Penicillin Act, 1947, which controls the sale and supply of the substances to which it applies.

1954 No. 1647—The Therapeutic Substances (Supply of Oxytetracycline for Agricultural Purposes) Regulations, 1954.

(a) These Regulations permit the sale or supply under certain conditions of pig and poultry food containing oxytetracycline (proprietary name terramycin) or of oxytetracycline supplement,

- The conditions include: (b)
 - (i) the strength of the feeding stuff or supplement or of a feeding stuff containing more than one antibiotic; (ii) containers to be used ;

 - (iii) labelling.

(c) Another provision of the Regulations amends the permitted strength of aureomycin supplement and penicillin supplement.
