A PROCLAMATION

Revoking a Proclamation, dated the 31st day of May, 1955, declaring the existence of a State of Emergency for the purposes of the Emergency Powers Act, 1920.

Whereas by virtue of Our Proclamation, dated the Thirty-first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-five, We did declare the existence of a state of emergency for the purposes of the Emergency Powers Act, 1920 :

And Whereas it appears to Us that the state of emergency has now ceased to exist, and that it is expedient that the said Proclamation should be revoked accordingly :

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain that the said Proclamation of the Thirty-first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-five, is revoked.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-first day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five, and in the Fourth year of Our Reign.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875

In virtue of the power conferred on me by Section 53 of the Explosives Act, 1875, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, I, The Right Honourable George B. Hanna, Q.C., M.P., being the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, hereby appoint Sergeant David McClure Chesney (No. 5774), of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, as an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the said Act, and do hereby direct him to exercise only such powers and to perform such duties under the said Act as I shall from time to time assign to him.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875

Whereas Sergeant Robert Irwin (No. 4092), of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, was on the 31st July, 1947, appointed to be an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the Explosives Act, 1875 :

And Whereas the said Sergeant Robert Irwin is no longer available for the duties of Inspector :

Now, I, The Right Honourable George B. Hanna, Q.C., M.P., being the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in virtue of the power conferred on me by Section 53 of the said Act and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the said Sergeant Robert Irwin shall from this day cease to exercise the powers and perform the duties of an Inspector under the said Act.
