CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 to 1943

WHEREAS by Regulation 8 of the regulations to which the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts

(Northern Ireland), 1922 to 1943, apply (being a regulation made by the Minister of Home Affairs and having effect, and to be enforced in like manner and having effect, and to be enforced in like manner as regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922) it is provided that if it appears to the Minister of Home Affairs that the publication or continued publication of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter is prejudicial to, or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland, the said Minister may by order prohibit Ireland, the said Minister may by order prohibit for any specified period the publication of any such newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter:

AND WHEREAS it is further provided by the said Regulation that if any person shall, within such specified period, print, publish, circulate or distribute or be in any way concerned in the printing, pubilication, circulation, or distribution of any news-paper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter, the publication of which has been pro-hibited under that said Regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence against the regulations to which the aforesaid Acts apply:

AND WHEREAS it appears to me, the said Minister, that the publication or continued publication of the newspapers hereafter in this order specified is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland:

NOW THEREFORE, I, The Right Honourable George B. Hanna, Q.C., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 to 1943, and the said Regulation 8, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the publication and distribution of the newsthat the publication and distribution of the newspapers entitled :-

> "The United Irishman" "Resurgent Ulster' "Gair Uladh"

under those titles or under any other title or description whatever, or any part of the said news-papers, shall be, and are hereby, prohibited in Northern Ireland as from the 1st day of January, 1956, until the 31st day of December, 1956.
