## TRUNK ROAD IMPROVEMENT AT PURDYSBURN

The Ministry of Commerce hereby gives notice that it proposes to construct a new length of road in substitution for a length of the existing Belfast-Newcastle trunk road in the townlands of Ballydollahgan and Knockbreckan, Co. Down. In accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Roads Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, the Ministry also gives notice that it proposes to make an Order under Sections 1 and 3 of the Act, the general effect of which will be as follows:

1. The new length of road, which is from a point on the present trunk road in the townland of Ballydollahgan approximately 120 yards north of its junction with the Purdysburn to Comber road (C.270) for a length of approximately 700 yards in a southerly direction to a point on the trunk road in the townland of Knockbreckan approximately 610 yards south of that junction will become a trunk road on the date of coming into force of the Order.
2. That section of the existing Trunk Road which lies between the aforementioned points will cease to be a trunk road on the 1st day of April next, after the new trunk road is opened for the purposes of through traffic.
3. The Ministry will be authorised to stop up (a) the junctions which will exist between the new trunk road when constructed and the existing trunk road at points approximately 590 yards south and 76 yards north respectively of the junction of the trunk road and the Purdysburn-Comber road; (b) the existing junction between the trunk road and the Purdysburn-Comber road. Short connecting roads in lieu of the stopped-up junctions will be provided.

The aforementioned works are delineated on a map, a copy of which, together with a copy of the draft Order, may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period of 40 days from the 12th day of June, 1956, at either of the undermentioned offices:—

## THE THERAPEUTIC SUBSTANCES (CONTROL OF SALE AND SUPPLY) REGULATIONS, 1956.

These regulations bring within the scope of the Penicillin Act, 1947 (which controls the sale and supply of the substances to which it applies), bacitracin, tetracycline and salts thereof viomycin and salts thereof and any substance the chemical and biological properties of which are identical with or similar to those of bacitracin or viomycin or of any salt of viomycin, but which is not produced by living organisms.

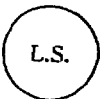

INTOXICATING LIQUOR

COMPENSATION: CHARGES IN RESPECT OF LICENCES

Order, dated 5th June, 1956, made by the Ministry of Finance, under Section 3 of the Intoxicating Liquor Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as amended by the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925.

1. In pursuance of sub-sections (3) (b) and (4) of section three of the Intoxicating Liquor Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as amended by the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, the Ministry of Finance hereby prescribes that the rates at which charges are to be levied in respect of all licences for the sale of intoxicating liquor by retail granted or renewed during the year ending the 30th day of September, 1957, shall be fourteen shillings and tenpence for each pound sterling of the maximum rates of charge authorised by sub-section (1) of section one of the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925.
2. This Order may be cited as the Intoxicating Liquor (Compensation Charges) Order (Northern Ireland), 1956.
