

to whom the payment may properly be made thereunder; and with respect to matters incidental to such proof.

5.—(1) An official extract of any such appointment as is mentioned in Section 13 of the Judicial Factors (Scotland) Act, 1889, shall, in any case where any Government stock is specified in the extract, or in a certificate under seal by the accountant of court produced together with the extract, as belonging to or forming part of the estate under the charge of the person named in the extract, be deemed for the purpose of these Regulations to be a decree whereby the right to receive the princi-

pal moneys becoming payable on the redemption of that stock is vested in the person so named.

(2) In the application of these Regulations to Scotland the expression "infant" includes pupil or minor and the expression "guardian" includes tutor or curator.

KING'S BENCH DIVISION.—IN BANKRUPTCY.
