WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945

LINEN AND COTTON HANDKERCHIEF AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND LINEN PIECE GOODS WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND)

The Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Wages Council (Northern Ireland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance proposals for the amendment of the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1956 (Order N.I.H.G. (141)) (S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1956, No. 57) relating to statutory minimum remuneration.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within twenty-one days from 9th November, 1956. POST OFFICE TELEX SERVICE

Her Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that telex service will shortly become available between the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man on the one hand and Canada on the other hand.

Her Majesty's Postmaster General further gives notice, in accordance with paragraph (2) of regulation 2 and regulation 9 of the Telex Regulations, 1954, that, on and from the date service commences and until further notice, the charges for telex calls from the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man on the one hand and Canada on the other hand will be as follows:—
