IN THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE OF  
NORTHERN IRELAND

QUEEN'S BENCH DIVISION.—IN BANKRUPTCY

John B. Donegan of 273 Springfield Road and 32 Cairns Street, in the County of the City of Belfast, Draper, was on the 29th day of January, 1957, adjudged Bankrupt.
