INTOXICATING LIQUOR

COMPENSATION: CHARGES IN RESPECT OF
LICENCES

Order, dated 6th May, 1957, made by the Ministry of Finance under Section 3 of the Intoxicating Liquor Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as amended by the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925.

1.
