POISONS

The Minister of Home Affairs has made Regulations which provide that the purchase of an article by a person at the request of the Ministry of Home Affairs or the Pharmaceutical Inspector for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of Part III of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, shall be deemed not to be a purchase within the meaning of paragraph (b) of sub-section (5) of Section twenty-nine of the Act.

The Regulations (S.R. & O. (N.I.), 1957, No. 224) come into force on the 1st December, 1957, and remain in force for a period of one year unless sooner revoked.
