TRUNK ROAD IMPROVEMENT AT THE DEANERY,
ARMAGH

IN THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE IN NORTHERN IRELAND

QUEEN'S BENCH DIVISION.—IN BANKRUPTCY

Joseph Clarke, Junior, of Gortin, in the County of Tyrone, Grocer, Hardware and General Merchant, was on the 11th day of March, 1958, adjudged Bankrupt.

PUBLIC SITTINGS will be held before the Court at the Royal Courts of Justice (Ulster), Belfast, on Tuesday, the 15th day of April, 1958, and on Tuesday, the 22nd day of April, 1958, at the hour of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, whereat the Bankrupt is to attend, and to make a full disclosure and discovery of his Estate and Effects. Creditors may prove their Debts, and at the First Sitting choose a Creditors' Assignee. At the last Sitting the Bankrupt is required to finish his Examination.
