WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945

ROPE, TWINE AND NET WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND)

The Rope, Twine and Net Wages Council (Northern Ireland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance proposals for: (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Rope, Twine and Net Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1954 (Order N.I.R. (64)) (S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1954, No. 112) and (2) the revocation of the Rope, Twine and Net Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1957 (Order N.I.R. (70)) (S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1957, No. 91).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained from the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within twenty-one days from 11th April, 1958.
