TRUNK ROAD IMPROVEMENT AT BALLYMACORMICK, DROMORE, CO. DOWN

The Ministry of Commerce hereby gives notice, in accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Roads Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, that it proposes to make an Order under Section 3(5) of the Act, the effect of which will be to enable the Ministry to abandon as public roads the following lengths of the old Trunk Road in the townland of Ballymacormick :—

1. A length of approximately 200 yards extending in a north-easterly direction from a point approximately 370 yards south-west of the junction of the Trunk Road with the unclassified road No. 277 (Backnamullagh Cross Road);
2. A length of approximately 60 yards extending in a northerly direction from a point approximately 90 yards south of the aforementioned junction; and
3. A length of approximately 160 yards extending in a north-westerly direction from a point approximately 210 yards north-west of the aforementioned junction.

The Ministry will also be authorised to stop-up the length of road described at 1 above at its north end, and the length of road described at 2 above at its south end.
