SEIZURE NOTICE (LIVESTOCK)

I, Const. George Harris, being an authorised officer for the purpose of the Imported Livestock Order, 1958, hereby give notice that on the 16th day of June, 1958, at, or in the vicinity of Newry Market Yard (place) the undermentioned Seven (number) livestock were seized in accordance with the provisions of the said Order.

Any person claiming that the livestock were at the time of seizure his property and either—

- (a) that they were not imported, removed, or brought into the United Kingdom from the

Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man or the Republic of Ireland, or

(b) that they were not so imported, removed or brought in in contravention of the said Order, may give notice in writing to that effect to the Head or other Constable in charge at R.U.C.
