SUMMARY JURISDICTION

PETTY SESSIONS DISTRICTS AND TIMES

Order dated 1st September, 1958, made by the Ministry of Home Affairs under sub-section (1) of Section Ten of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, and sub-section (1) of Section One of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1958.

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sub-section (1) of Section Ten of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, and subsection (1) of Section One of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1958, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, after consultation with the County Court Judge and Resident Magistrates concerned, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

- As and from the 1st day of October, 1958, the Petty Sessions District of Whiteabbey shall be known as the Petty Sessions District of Newtownabbey and, accordingly, any reference to the Petty Sessions District of Whiteabbey in any Order or in any court proceeding pending at the date of this Order shall be construed as a reference to the Petty Sessions District of Newtownabbey.
- The townlands of Altigarron, Ballyahagan, Ballygomartin (part of), Ballysillan Upper and Ligoniel, at present forming part of the Petty Sessions District of Dunmurry, shall be added to and form part of the Petty Sessions District of Newtownabbey.
- 3. The townland of Ballyutoag, at present forming part of the Petty Sessions District of

Templepatrick, shall be added to and form part of the Petty Sessions District of Newtownabbey.
